

2021 Elsie Burkhalter Award

This award is to recognize an individual in Oregon who exhibits the dedication, enthusiasm and community involvement of the late Elsie Burkhalter. Elsie Burkhalter was an AFT member that led her local to win collective bargaining rights for all school employees in St. Tammany Parish, one of only a handful of school districts in Louisiana with collective bargaining. Elsie Burkhalter gave back to her community through her service on the University of Louisiana System Board of Supervisors for 18 years; she was the first woman and first African American to hold that position. She also served on the Slidell City Council and was involved in numerous organizations such as the Workforce Investment Board, Louisiana Center for Women in Government and Business, Slidell Women's Civic Club and the League of Women Voters. Elsie Burkhalter was unwavering in her work, her efforts for educators, students, and her community.

Nominations may be made by individual members; by a local through action of the membership or of the local executive council; by the AFT-Oregon Executive Council; or by AFT-Oregon staff.
